



Chatham's fifth annual turkey trot will be held Thanksgiving Day, Nov. 27

As a kick-off to the holiday season The Chatham Turkey Trot (TheChathamTurkeyTrot.org) will host its sixth annual Thanksgiving Day Turkey Trot in the Highlands section of Chatham Township on Nov. 27.

Proceeds of the race will benefit the Chatham Township Volunteer Fire Department and the Diabetes Research Institute. In 2013, more than 600 runners participated, helping to raise more than \$15,000 for these two organizations.

The race takes place at the Highlands section of Chatham Township at the corner of Seminole Way and 110 Van Houton Avenue. Registration and warm-ups at 8 a.m. Family fun run starts at 8:30 a.m.

Register and pay online at TheChathamTurkeyTrot.org before Nov. 17 at 5 p.m. to receive a T-shirt. Cost is: one-mile Family Fun Run: \$15/person; USA Track & Field Certified 5K Race: \$20/person.

Day of the race cost is \$25/person for all races. Make checks payable to "The Chatham Turkey Trot."

The Chatham Township Volunteer Fire Department will hang a 50-foot American flag from Ladder 12 (its 100 foot aerial ladder truck) above the race course as runners race through one of the most scenic neighborhoods of Chatham Township.
